Methodological Approach

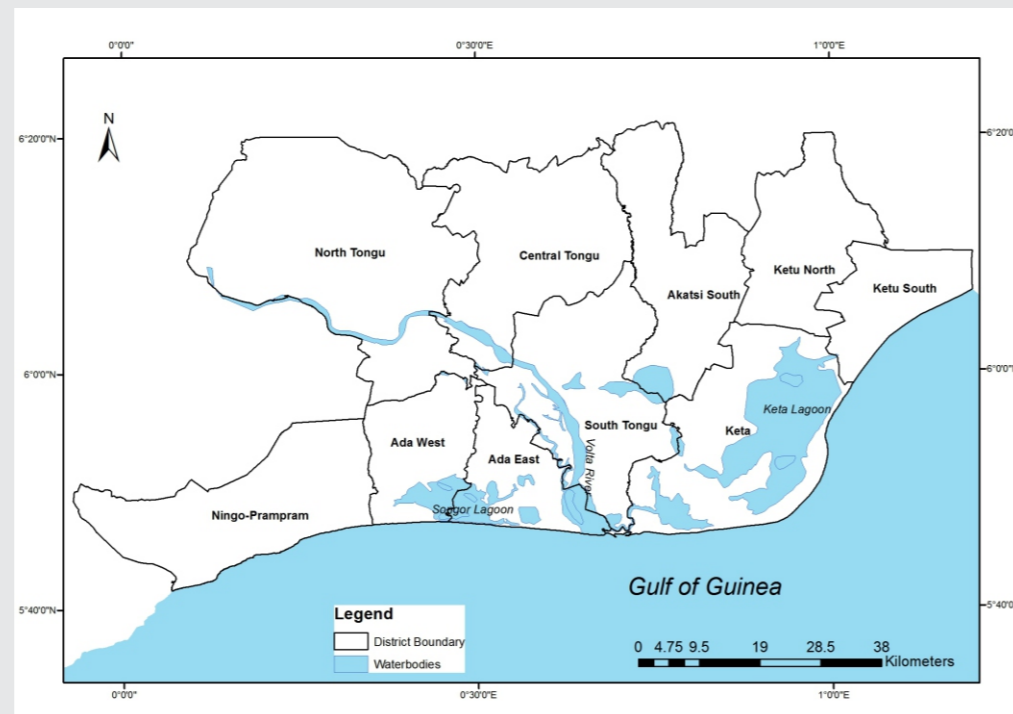
- The approach involves Dynamic Stakeholder Mapping (DSM) with focus on interest and influence of key stakeholders.
- Inter and intra analysis of various levels of stakeholders.

Results and Outputs

- Majority of the 130 key stakeholders have been made aware of the DECCMA Project.
- Politicians at the national level had higher influence but lower interest as compared to

politicians at the local level who had higher interest but relatively lower influence. Community members had high interest but low influence.

- Improvement in respective levels of influence and interest.
- Migration options are considered by community members in areas like Keta and Ada as a means of reducing their vulnerabilities to climate change effects (Useful for WP3/6).
