Access:

The readers' entrance is on the Place du Père Teilhard de Chardin. Once you are through security, go up the stairs to the reading room. Turn right to find the reading room, and hand your card to the attendant to be assigned a seat number.

For temporary visits you will need to fill out a *laissez-passer* and get it signed by the person behind the desk; you will show this when you re-enter the building.

Storage:

There are lockers available to store belongings; turn left at the top of the stairs to find the cloakroom.

Ordering Materials:

Materials can be ordered in advance via your [Espace Personnel](#), or on the day using the paper slips in the reading room.

Internet:

There is WiFi available on site: connect to "BNF".

Food and Drink:

Unlike at most other BnF sites, there are no dedicated facilities, although there is a vending machine in the cloakroom.
