







Health and Employment After Fifty (the HEAF study)

Welcome to the HEAF study annual newsletter! You may have already noticed that we haven't included a questionnaire this year. We are giving you a break which will allow us to look more fully at the huge quantity of information you have all so kindly sent us over the last five years of data collection. Don't worry, the HEAF study isn't coming to an end we will be back in contact with another questionnaire in about a year from now.

Your involvement

As you know, the HEAF study is a research project which originally included more than 8000 people who lived in England and were aged over 50 years. We are interested in **all of you**, specifically your health, wellbeing, what work you do or did (paid or unpaid), how and when you decide(d) to retire and whether or not you are caring for others around you.

You joined our study back in 2013/2014. More than 6,000 of you are still helping us by completing our annual questionnaires - Thank you!

We will still need your help next year!

Whether you are: employed/self-employed/unemployed/retired/caring for someone/or volunteering - we still want you to be part of the HEAF study!
