You can use calculators in all exams as long as they are the approved models <b>No, you can only use approved model calculators in exams <i>that specify that exams are allowed</i></b>		X
You can take your iPod into the exam room <b>No you are not permitted to take electronic devices into the exam</b>		X
You must turn off your mobile phone and keep it in a see through bag on your desk <b>Correct</b>	X	
You may use an approved translation dictionary in the exam <b>Correct</b>	X	
You can view your exam timetable online <b>Correct, You can access your individual timetable via SUSSED and either your Programme or Services tab, which will then link to the 'Exam Timetable' icon.</b>	X	
You should contact your student office if you are unwell before your exam <b>If you are feeling ill before your exam, you should notify your student office as soon as possible. There is no need to advise the Exams, Awards &amp; Graduation team.</b>	X	
You must bring your student ID card into the exam <b>Correct - FAILURE TO PRODUCE YOUR ID MAY RESULT IN YOU BEING UNABLE TO TAKE YOUR EXAMINATION.</b>	X	
Pens and pencils are provided <b>False – you must bring your own pens and pencils</b>		X
You should not have more than 3 consecutive exams <b>Correct - Three consecutive exams means (for example): a morning exam, followed by an afternoon exam, followed by a morning exam</b>	X	
No food or drink is allowed in the exam room <b>False – you are allowed to bring a clear bottle of water – no other food or drink is permitted</b>		X
You may be asked to show that you do not have any devices (e.g. headphones) in your clothing <b>Correct</b>	X	
You must start each question on a new side of paper in the answer book <b>Correct</b>	X	
You must cross through any rough working <b>Correct - any rough working must be entered in the answer books provided and be crossed through to show clearly that it is not intended as a submitted answer</b>	X	
You must be accompanied by an invigilator on cigarette breaks <b>False – cigarette breaks are not permitted during the exam!</b>		X
