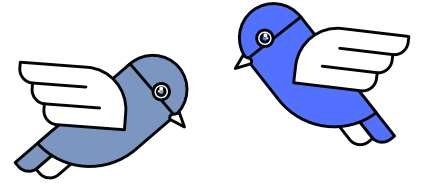


Making a bird bath

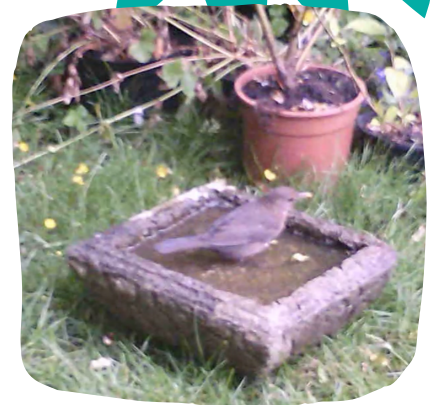
What you need

1. A shallow, watertight bowl such as a plant tray, an upturned dustbin lid or a large plastic container
2. Some stones or gravel to go in the bath
3. Bricks or rocks to steady the bath
4. Water



Steps

1. Use bricks or rocks to steady the tray or upturned lid
 2. Put some stones or gravel in the bath, for the birds to stand on
 3. Fill the bath with water
 4. Now watch! Birds will visit most when the weather is hot
- The best bird baths are shallow, less than 10 centimetres deep, with sloping sides and more than 30 centimetres across.
 - A good place to put the birdbath is somewhere you can see it, next some bushes so the birds can also hide.

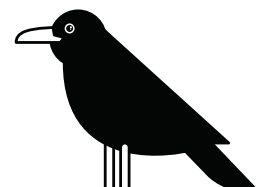
