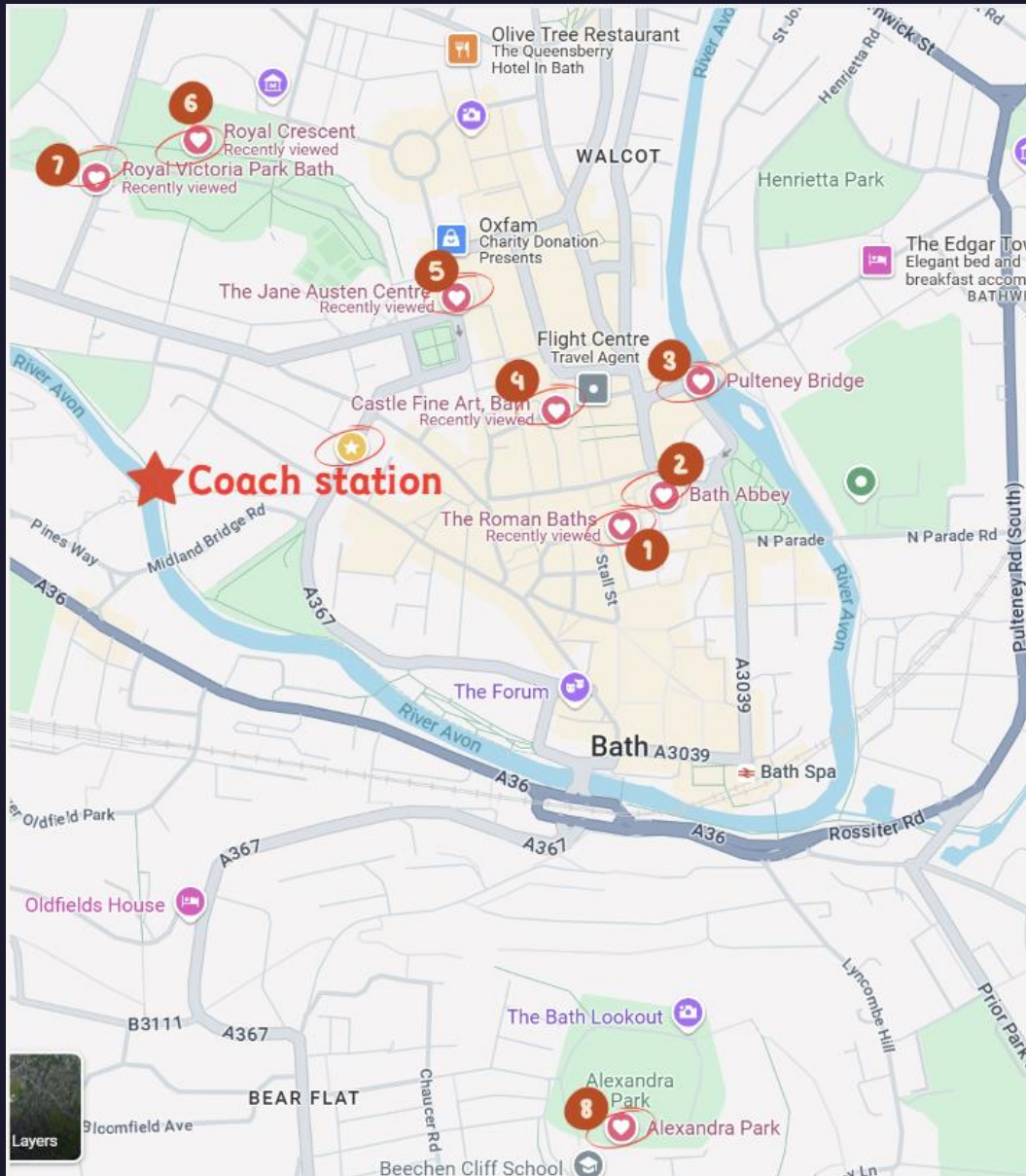

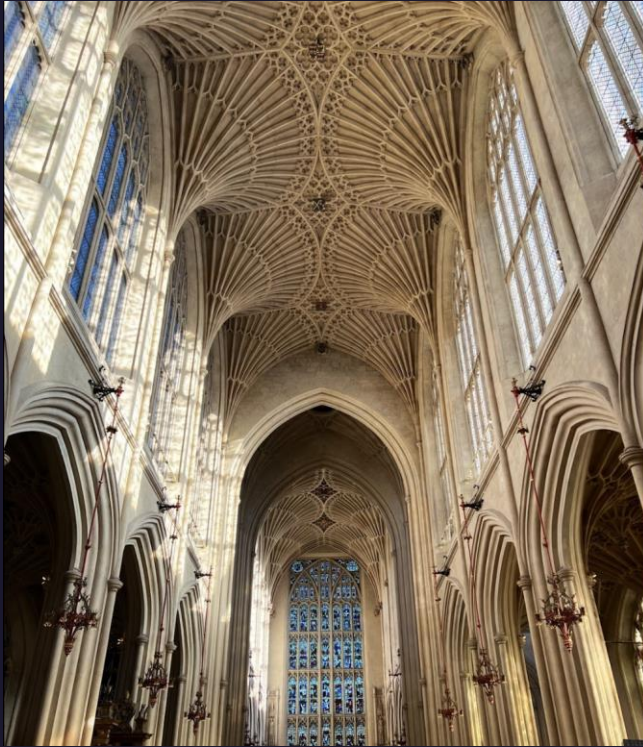

③Pulteney Bridge
